#### Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program Outcomes

- 887 households requested assistance with housing
- 635 households were identified as homeless or at imminent risk
- 222 literally homeless households obtained permanent housing
- 413 families were diverted from homelessness

Food Program - SCCAP distributed over \$439,210 dollars of USDA food (550,161 lbs) through partnerships with volunteer organizations serving their community.
