Homeless Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program Outcomes

- 789 households requested assistance with housing
- 703 households were identified as homeless or at imminent risk
- 129 literally homeless households obtained permanent housing
- 574 families were diverted from homelessness

Food Program - SCCAP distributed over 571,377 pounds of USDA food and a total of 703,937 lbs of donated and Holiday food distributed through partnerships with volunteer organizations serving their community at a value of \$438,229.70. (12, 302 Emergency USDA Food Boxes were distributed)
